A review of the Partnership Changes

Online meetings are better at the moment as some people might struggle with in person meetings

Carers' are listening more and that is good You are confident to ask questions in this space

You would like support to know how payments for your role will affect benefits

It was very good, everyone did well and those present, including the CQC heard it

Roadshows and the website development Transport and vaccinations for vulnerable people, tests

should be free for people with a learning disability

Steve agreed more time is needed and has built this into the review work and outcomes.

Steve has been sharing within HCC that time is needed to work in co-production





4 July 2022 CQC visit today

Topic: Cost of Living

Day care fees and social activity costs have increased No one has stopped doing activity at increased prices No one is worried currently, but maybe in the winter You think people who live alone might struggle with bills more or who don't have family to help Some family members have said petrol is expensive Increased costs could affect people's mental health

What could help?

Have more support, more carers, more time Disabled people could be prioritised for help Why is disability stuff cut first?

We Did

You said you would like to discuss this topic, which we have done today There were no identified concerns – review before winter

Stuart explained there are cuts across the council and less money to spend. Learning Disability Services, Social care, Childrens' Services, Roads, potholes.

Stuart is happy to come to the next meeting and talk about 2023 savings plan – all agreed they would like this

You Said



There is local staffing issues and you are worried about your friends mental health. You said you friend gets ready to go out and then it doesn't happen

You said you have worked with volunteers before and liked this. It would be a good idea

Could Self Advocates be at the training for new providers

We Did

This is a problem everywhere – not aware of people not being able to go out

Ask people to contact CART with concerns

There is work to train and have more volunteers who might support people to attend events

There will be a focus on learning skills so there is less need for paid support



You Said



How are you saving money

You worry about peoples mental health if they are stuck in hospital

You helped with the automated review testing

We Did

More Supported Living flats built Cheaper and costs less then Residential Care

Lots of work happening on this. Hampshire, Southampton, Portsmouth and Isle of Wight working together

- To learn best ways to discharge people
- Trauma impact of moving a lot
- Stop people going into hospital if not needed

Automated reviews should reduce the waiting list for reviews Feedback has been good so far

Supported living bills will go up, what can we do about it?

More easy read documents about it

People with disabilities in the community are more at risk than others People living Independently Older people in their 80's and 90's

Jason said people who live alone are a focus Food vouchers have been given out from government Libraries are doing a lot

Discussion – reasons why there is a problem:

- Covid caused workforce problem

- Several things happening at the same time

You have friends who need help

The post isn't good and on strike

Need to network and tell neighbours and friends how to keep warm and save money



We talked through these issues and how they impact on each other

Farnborough Group have done some work about keeping warm

Topic – Providers and Quality of life



You Said

5 December 2022

There are people going out less to activities due to staff shortages

This could affect mental health and mood

There are more agency staff are who do not know the person and are more expensive Some support workers have left

About a specific safeguarding issue relating to a broken door

We Did

Stuart said most providers are short staffed by 20-30% Stuart offered to follow up – self-advocate to give name after meeting via Voiceability

More money is being given to providers soon There is a recruitment drive for carers Piloting a volunteer scheme to support 30-40 people from January 2023 in New Forest area

Stuart confirmed this was being addressed with the provider currently



You Said

5 December 2022

You were involved in selecting a name for the new volunteer service

What can self-advocates do

Shall we discuss this topic and cost of living in the new year for 2 or 3 sessions

Shall we ask a survey to others

Find out how affecting people who have a learning disability and carers What would make a difference

We Did

Your suggestions have been given to the team choosing the name

At the next Partnership meeting there will be discussion about future topics as a wider group An important issue for next 6-12 months

There is a Cost of Living group at the council that research could be fed back to. A survey could ask:

- What financial pressures mean to people
- What people think might help
- What information people need

You Said

5 December 2022

Can the survey be done like the review process for Hampshire Learning Disability Partnership

You would be happy for future meetings to be on a Thursday afternoon
