We talked about road safety and different incidents that have happened

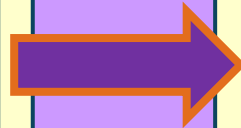
Being Safe Staying Safe Working Group

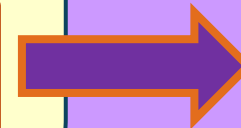
You Said
