Tracy gave an update on Annual Health Checks from February

Uptake of health checks has increased to 69.4% which is 5.6% below the national guidance. It is moving up which is good.



This year the number of Annual health checks has increased by 521



Annual health checks for 14-17 year olds has increased 10%
